FIRST STEPS

At Romsey Abbey Primary School we support families and children with the choices they make about their school. Parents are able to choose a full time provision from the first day, or they may choose to attend part time initially. It is important to note that parents have the right not to send their child to school full time until the term after their child's fifth birthday.



STARTING SCHOOL

Once reception places are allocated by Hampshire County Council, a whole range of getting to know you visits will be arranged to ensure there are plenty of familiar places and people to enable our new pupils to thrive.

Firstly the Head of Foundation Stage will arrange a New Intake meeting for new parents and those with siblings already attending Romsey Abbey CE School. At this meeting, families will be welcomed by staff, governors and clergy.



FINDING OUT ABOUT EACH OTHER

A visit to see the children in their pre-schools is arranged. This is when professionals will share important transition information and plan the pre-schools visit to our school; we have a lovely time getting to know each other. We then invite you and your child to attend regular story-time sessions in school. This introduces the children to their new environment and helps us start to become a familiar face!



HOME VISITS

These are an excellent way for the class teacher and support staff to meet your child in an environment they are confident and secure. During this visit children will share their favourite toys and games with the Foundation Stage team. In addition, you will be invited to attend a short meeting with the class teacher at school. This is an informal meeting and an opportunity for us to share important information which will enable your child's transition to school to be as smooth as possible.

QUICK GET UP ITS TIME FOR SCHOOL

For many children a whole week of full time learning and play is a big step. We do understand and its not unusual for children to snuggle in a book or home corner for a rest during the day.

Parents and carers are very welcome to stay and help settle new children we encourage families to help make sure coming to school is a happy event. Keep us up to date with all contact details, it is vital we can reach you at all times of the day. Please let us know before 09:30 am if your child is not coming to school.

LUNCH TIME

Mrs. Newton is our school cook and she cooks all our lovely dinners supported by her team. Children from reception to the end of year 2 are provided with a free school dinner. This is paid for by the national government for all infant pupils.

PACKED LUNCH

You may choose to provide your child with a packed lunch box. We would encourage you to make this as healthy as possible and ask that you do not include; glass bottles, sweets, sugary drinks or nuts.

OR THIRSTY?

Water Bottles

All pupils should bring a named water bottle to school every day.

FREE MILK

All children under 5 are entitled to free milk, pupils are registered on line by the school.

MID- MORNING BREAK

Mrs. Newton bakes bread rolls every day, these are available with other healthy snacks for a small charge. A daily free snack, of fresh fruit or vegetable, is provided for every child aged 7 years or younger.




“Bring your rucksack and coat and put them away, your school wellies on the rack and water bottle in the tray! Give your family big hugs and kisses... All aboard!”

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

There is a great deal of research to show that pupils with outstanding attendance and punctuality do better. However there are times that due to circumstances beyond your control may mean that you arrive late, or are absent from school. Please alert the office as soon as possible to ensure we make provision for this eventuality. If a pupil is absent and we have received no communication then a member of staff will contact you. We do appreciate the challenges of booking medical and dental appointments outside of school hours, however we would ask that every effort is made to ensure 100% attendance is achieved by your child. The school is not able to authorise holidays during the school term.

OUR EXTENDED DAY

From 3:30 until 06:00pm, Stay and Play provides child care , an extensive range of activities and opportunities including; group role play, table top activities, indoor and outdoor physical actives, wet and messy play, and of course lots of arts and crafts.

HABITS OF MIND

At Romsey Abbey CE Primary School we have 7 Habits of Mind to help all children discover how to be a successful and thoughtful learner.

The teaching of the Habits of Mind is supported by a team of friendly puppets who help us understand what each habit involves and what it looks like in our learning.

Resilience: Never give up: keep having a go

Self-Management: Make good choices; be ready to learn and set goals

Collaboration: Working together as a team; sharing ideas

Creativity: Imagine, take risks, solve problems

Reflection: Think it through, decide what's next

We creatively endeavour to ensure these vital learning habits feed into everything we do and help us to deliver a rich and varied curriculum that excites and challenges all the children in our school.
